Tournament: to start immediately after dinner and announcement of the crib rules.

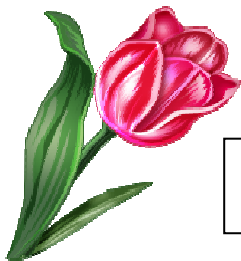

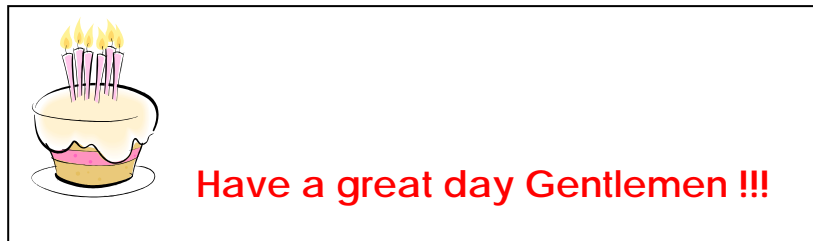

CLUB NEWS

LUNCHEON – March 5th

There were 21 Gyros in attendance at the noon meeting at the Carriage House Inn. The meeting was chaired by Steve Denny in the absence of our President, Bonar Irving. Since our guest speaker was going to be a little late, Mr. Denny stated he would have to speak very slowly to try and kill some time. Ethan Compton stated that it didn't matter what Steve did as we were not going to listen anyway !!

Our guest speaker was Lesley Keyter who operates a travel agency known as "The Travel Lady". Lesley spoke on traveling in Europe on a coach tour and how to make the most of your trip.

Here are some of the points she highlighted:

- Choose your itinerary well – look out for "SEE / VIEW / VISIT". If the itinerary says "SEE" you will be able to take a photo from your bus as you pass by. If it says "VIEW" the bus will stop so that you can get off the bus to take your photo, and if it says "VISIT" you will actually tour the site.
- Check the number of nights in each destination – look for 2 or 3 night stops – don't end up on a "Pajama Tour" where you are in a different hotel every night.
- Choose a tour that accommodates less passengers – better tours take only 40 passengers.
- Check the location of the hotels on your trip – better tours will offer hotels in central locations.
- Check what the tour actually includes – meals, tours, etc.
- Is the tour guaranteed? If they do not get the minimum number of passengers required, will they cancel?
- Are optional excursions offered, and if so, what is the average cost?
- Is trip cancellation or interruption included – NEVER book without it.
- What is the role of the guide – will the guide and driver expect tips?
- What is the average age, are children allowed, what is the minimum age?
- Is there a bathroom on the bus?
- Check the track record and status of the tour company and check that they are accredited members of ACTA, TICO, ASTA and other industry associations.

The guest speaker was Alan Norris, from Carma Homes, who spoke on ending homelessness in Calgary. Norris stated that in January of 2007 the "Calgary Committee to End Homelessness" was formed in response to Calgary's growing homelessness crisis. The twenty-nine members who formed the committee came from major companies, various charitable foundations, the Mayor, councilors, an MLA, an MP, and other organizations.

The 10 year plan put forward by the committee was not to find new ways to manage homelessness, but to end it.

Norris stated that the approach would be a "hand up" and not a "hand out" which resulted in many questions and a lively discussion.

After checking with Telus, they said it was true, so do not dial 90# for anyone!!!!
